The store is the only one of its kind in Birmingham and will carry a line of car parts and equipment and tools for gasoline stations, truck operators, garages and repair shops. The building was designed to house wholesale auto parts with special bins and shelving and with a drive-in arrangement in the rear for shipping and receipt of stock. Parking space for customers is provided in the rear.

The rear section of the building houses the machine shop, designed and equipped for automotive work.

The business is managed by Benjamin T. Martin, formerly with the Johnston Auto Parts of Ferndale.

Mr. Berz today announced completion of both the east and west runway and also of the northeast and southwest runway. An additional 2,000 feet of drainage has just been completed and the new hangar to care for 15 planes is to be completed before the end of the year.
