## Bloomfield Hills Is Defeated 12 to 6 In Opening Grid Battle

Bloomfield Hills football team took a 12 to 6 defeat in its opening game of the season at the Hills school field Friday afternoon at the hands of Log Cabin High School, southeast of Birmingham a 12 mile drive. Log Cabin proved much heavier and better equipped for the game but did not put up any more determined fight than did the losers.

The Hills flashed a powerful defense but proved weak on attack. They did open with some long pass plays in the closing minutes of the game and connected with several passes for touchdowns. Log Cabin scored at the half and close on an interception of the Hills pass and a run of about 70 yards. The other marker came in the third quarter on long end runs with power blocking and a couple of pretty pass plays that had the Hills defense bewildered.

All attempts at point after touchdown failed. Log Cabin scored as the half conditioned, with a goodly lot of replacements. The opposite was true of the Hills, with only 15 men in uniform.

Bloomfield Hills is in the Twin County Conference along with Log Cabin, Auburn Heights, Big Beaver and Fraser.
