Marjorie Row Wins District Title At Oakland Hills, Fri.

Marjorie Row made her years of experience in top-flight golf pay dividends Friday at Oakland Hills when she defeated Mrs. W. H. Bretzlaff, Jr., Detroit, 5 and 4, to win the Women's District championship.

It was the third straight time she has paced the field. She won in the 1941 and 1942 finals and then, following the two-year lapse of the event because of the war, she came back to show the way again.

Far the first 18 holes of the match Miss Row had a real struggle, and despite a 78 she recessed at noon with only two-hole lead. It was a different story in the afternoon. The long grind—it was the first time Mrs. Bretzlaff had attempted 36 holes in more than three years—began to tell. As a result she lost the nineteenth and again went three down.

Still putting up stubborn resistance, she halved the rest of the holes to the firm for a 44, compared to Miss Row's 43. But whatever hope Mrs. Bretzlaff had faded quickly as Miss Row won the twenty-eighth and thirtieth to go five up. She was crowned the champion on the thirty-second green, after halving the last two holes.

Thus Miss Row completed her domination of the field. She never was down in the final. On her way to the title she qualified with a 78, then defeated Mrs. G. A. Wettlaufer, Mrs. Weiss, Miss Margaret Russell and Mrs. Bretzlaff.
