Oak Leaf Cluster Is Presented Gen. Stanley E. Reinhart

Major General Stanley E. Reinhart, of Birmingham, was presented the Oak Leaf Cluster to the Distinguished Service Medal on Tuesday, April 9, by General Jacob L. Devers, commanding general, Army Ground Force, in ceremonies at the Pentagon Building, Washington, D. C.

The award, which is equal to the receipt of an additional Distinguished Service Medal, was made in recognition of his services as commanding general of the 65th Infantry Division from August 1943 to May 1945. His division was committed to action in March, 1945, and fought the enemy across Germany and into Austria.

General Reinhart's courage and loyal devotion to duty were responsible to a high degree for the important contributions made by the 65th Infantry Division in the success of Allied arms over Germany.

General Reinhart has also served with the 25th Infantry Division in Hawaii and Guadalcanal. He has been decorated with the Distinguished Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, the Silver Star Medal,

the Bronze Star Medal, the French Legion of Honor, the French Croix de Guerre with palm, and the Russian Order of the Patriotic War, 1st Class. He is an honorary member of the Russian Guards.
