**Two Art Exhibits Are Being Arranged For Museum of Cranbrook Art Academy**

The Museum of the Cranbrook Academy of Art is arranging two current exhibitions, "Variety in Abstraction," and "Paintings from Latin America," circulated by the Museum of Art, New York City.

"Variety in Abstraction" features the work of fifteen painters by leading abstract artists of this century, such as Braque, Picasso, Leger, Klee, Miro, Matisse, Kadinsky, and Matta.

There are two main currents in the abstract painting of the 20th century. One is based upon an intellectual, structural, objective approach; the other more emotional in spirit, fluid and organic in design and romantic in its spontaneity. Visitors to this exhibition will see how Klee and Arp took up Kadinsky's early rhythmic style of abstractions as a base for their personal fancies, to be translated further by Matta, in his surrealists such as Mason and Miro. These paintings, with descriptive titles, will give the visitor a glimpse of the rich variety in this work of the abstractionist.
