### Mrs. James Couzens Contributes to Support Of Belgian Boy and Little Italian Girl Orphaned As A Consequence of Recent War

Among 84 Michigan residents contributing through the Foster Parents' Plan for War Children to the support of European children orphaned or separated from their parents, is Mrs. James Couzens of Long Lake road, Bloomfield Hills.

Mrs. Couzens is now providing for the care of two children, a little Belgian boy named Georges Kempenaers, and a small Italian girl, Elena D'Angeli. In the past she has provided for the support of other children, most of whom were reunited with their families through the efforts of the Foster Parents' Plan group.

I am very much interested in little Elena D'Angeli," Mrs. Couzens said. "The first report I received on her from the Plan informed me that she was a very orphan, with absolutely no relatives or friends except those in the Plan. She was at school one morning and returned to find her home in ruins, demolished by a terrific bombardment which killed her father, mother and brother."

Found in Pitiable Condition  
For many weeks the child wandered through the streets without care or food other than what she found. Mrs. Couzens stated. When the Plan workers found her she was in pitiable condition. They did not know how she had survived as long as she did. After her first bath and meal in the Plan nursery, her general state seemed better, but then she lapsed back to being shy, moody and melancholy.

"The child writes to me regularly in her native language," Mrs. Couzens said. "Naturally I am quite concerned about her future, as she has no relatives, but I will continue to look after her until she is able to take care of herself."

Writes Regularly  
Georges Kempenaers, the little Belgian boy, also writes quite often, as did all the children she has cared for in the past year. The Plan sends in regular reports.

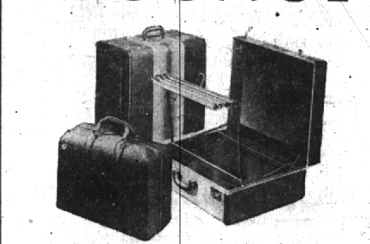
