Public hearing held on Special Assessment Roll No. 251 creating a special assessment district to defray cost of constructing a bituminous surfacing, curb and gutter on Henrietta Street between Fourth and Fifth streets.

Public hearing held on Special Assessment Roll No. 250 creating a special assessment district to defray cost of constructing curb and gutter with gravel road on Buckingham between Edensborough and St. Andrews Road. Roll confirmed.

Communication received from Arvid C. Peterson and Howard E. Tuggey with respect to easements over lots 1 to 7 inclusive of Oakland Villas Annex Subdivision. Referred to City Manager.

Manager authorized to purchase 8,000 gallons of gasoline from the Standard Oil Company.

Manager authorized to extend contract with the Ohio Drilling Company for an additional test well, also to secure an option for a site on the Eastside for the development program for the "Federal Housing Project" has been tentatively set out for approval by the FPHA and the City of Birmingham.
