Just to show the complexities of dishwashing, let's tell you about the differences of opinion in various states and the U. S. Public Health Service. The USPHS recommends a rinse period of two minutes at 170 degrees Fahrenheit for hand washing. But there is a marked deviation from this requirement in many communities. It is claimed.

Other Colleges Included This dishwashing experimentation, fellows, has attracted the interests of several other colleges and universities, too. Take Michigan State at East Lansing, for example: here 10 dishwashing ma-

chines are being tested in an investigation of time and temperature dishwashing standards. At Montana State College tests are under way to determine the best way to raise cleaning agents.

So keep your fingers crossed, boys, and hope these experiments are successful. It may mean that in a few years all we'll have to do to get the dishes "washed" is to pass them through a solution that automatically washes them, yet is composed of such a nature that it evaporates almost instantly when the dishes are stacked on the drainboard.

more strangers than Oak ever was. Yet there has been no suggestion that Woodward be improved and repaired."

Commissioner John E. Martz was in agreement that possibly there was some other route available that could more easily be opened up for the anticipated increase in traffic that would utilize such an access street in this area.

"In the manager's report which we have here tonight, it is suggested that there be no parking allowed on Oak between Woodward and the bridge," he remarked. "An Oak street car park in front of their homes, then it will be the only residential street in Birmingham where it can't be done. I feel the Oak street property owners have something to object to in this regard."

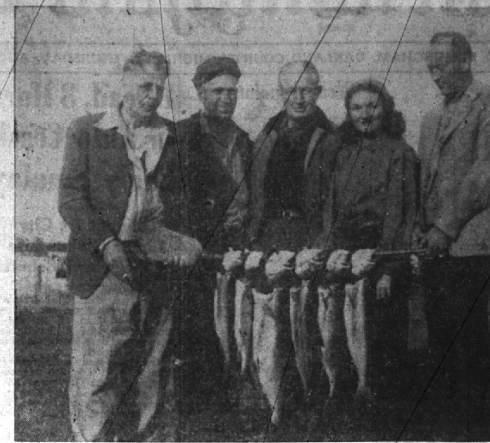
Should Consider Redding "Oak street is still residential, and if this improvement is put through, the street will be changed in character. I wonder if we really arrived at the answer to Oak street? It should be improved, I agree, but not to make it any more than a local street. If these people want an access street, then believe there is Redding road to consider. It connects Hunter with the western city limits at Chesworth. That street may offer a possibility."

Therefore, I urge serious consideration of Redding as the access street to this section," Martz concluded.

A member of the audience suggested that the Commission consider the advisability of extending Raynalde through to Woodward, rather than improving Redding.

In his report to the commission, City Manager Donald C. Egbert suggested that Oak street be improved with a 24-foot strip of concrete, from Woodward to the bridge, with a two-foot retaining wall between Lakeview and Lakeside drives to protect school children. He suggested that the cost should not be borne by the area, which would use the street as an access, but rather it should be borne by the property owners between the bridge and Woodward on and near Oak street.

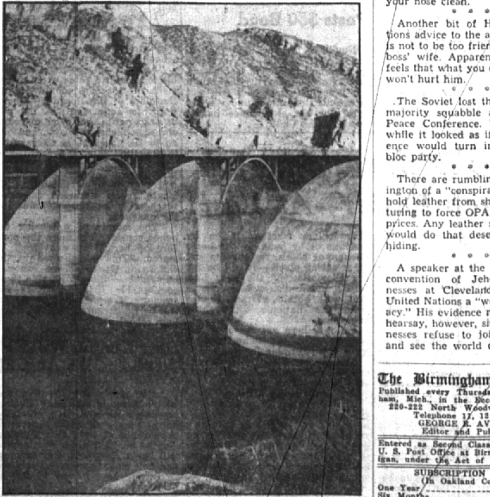
With this increased interest and talk of better playing fields and Birmingham's overflow of good baseball talent, next year promises to be a big softball year in the city.
