Lt. Russell Fisher Is Last Of Three Brothers To Return.

Russell H. Fisher, 256 Abbey road, will be a happy father when his third son comes from the Navy today. Lieutenant (jg) Russell H. Fisher, Jr. will be met by his father and two brothers, Ensign Robert A. Fisher, and Donald A. Fisher, ARM 3/c, both of whom returned from service recently.

Young Russell has been in service 35 months, and will return home from Yorktown, Va., where he is a captain's aide. He received training at Harvard University and was commissioned there in 1944. He then went overseas aboard the battleship "Idaho." His ship took part in the off-shore bombardment at Okinawa and stopped in the Philippines and Samar. He plans to go to the University of Michigan to major in political science.

His brother, Bob, returned Tuesday from Shanghai where he was in the legal office with the 7th fleet. He was under the V-12 program at Harvard University and was graduated from there and commissioned in 1948. He spent more than a year overseas, also being aboard the Ruyard Bay in the Pacific area. He plans to resume his education with the study of law at the University of Michigan in the fall.

The other brother, Donald A. Fisher, was in service 28 months, attached to the Naval Air Corps at the Manar Base in the Philippines. He was a member of a test crew for PBM flying boats in that area. He received his air crew wings at the Panama River Air School in May last year. He plans to attend Michigan State College this fall to study forestry and conservation.

Robert S. Keyes Released By Navy

Seaman first class Robert S. Keyes, 764 Hazelwood, returned home recently, discharged after 13 months in the Navy. Bob is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Hugh T. Keyes. Bob's brother, Richard L. Keyes, also returned home from service recently.

Bob was overseas for nine months on the oiler Yel-47, stopping at Guam, and cruising the coast of China and Korea.

Richard has been a flight officer in the Army Air Corps, and was in service for three and one-half years. For the last two and one-half years he has been overseas, last post being a large airfield at Wiesbaden, Germany. During the war he was connected with the airborne troop and glider command. Since the ending of hostilities he has been flying officers to and from various conference spots in the European theater.

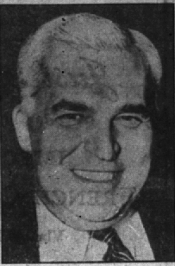
Released By Navy

Lt. Colonel Hartwell T. Bynum, 1045 Westchester Way, of the Infantry, was graduated recently from the school for Government of Occupied Areas at Carlisle Barracks, Pa.

He will leave shortly for the European theater, probably to be stationed in Germany, but is now at home with his wife and three sons. Lieutenant Richard T. Bynum, on terminal leave from the Army.

Col. Bynum, a second lieutenant in the last war and member of the Reserve Army, was called into service five years ago.
