Raisins Succor the Sugar Shortage
If desserters have seemed humdrum lately, let raisins lift them out of the doldrums. Raisins have a sugar saving sweetness, a delicate bouquet that turns plain-Jane dishes into Cinderellas. For instance, consider what raisins do to the homespun dish below—biacuit cups, fragile and flaky to fork's eager touch, encasing in their coffeeered walls the richest raisin filling.

A simple cornstarch pudding forms the base of this. But from there it sheds all semblance to such mammy fare. For pungent orange rind is added, and slivers of hard lemon peel. But the final touch, that binds these flavors all together is the raisin. A great handful is tossed in; and there they stew, mid all this aromatic goodness, until their sides have fairly burst with juice and the amber juices given richly of their honeyed sweetness.

Biscuit Nests with Creamy Raisin Filling
Scald in top of double boiler—2 1/2 cups milk.

Mix—1/4 cup cornstarch 1/2 cup sugar
Slowly pour milk over cornstarch mixture, blending well. Return to double boiler. Cook, stirring constantly, until mixture thickens. Continue cooking for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Beat—1 egg
Slowly pour cornstarch mixture over egg, stirring quickly. Return to double boiler. Cook for 2 minutes, stirring constantly.

Add—3 tablespoons shredded orange rind
3 tablespoons shredded lemon rind
1 1/2 cups seedless raisins.
Cool. Prepare biscuit recipe using 2 cups flour. Roll dough out thinly. Cut into 6 squares. Grease the backs of six shallow custard cups and invert on a flat surface. Place squares of biscuit dough on back of custard cups. Bake in a hot oven (425° F.) for 10 to 12 minutes or until brown. Remove from custard cups. Fill with Creamy Raisin Filling. Yields 6.
