School Masonry Given Repairs

Adams Elementary School and Baldwin Senior High School both had their masonry "pointed up" during the last few weeks and are now ready to weather all weather, according to Dr. Dwight B. Live, superintendent of schools. "Pointing up," to the layman means removing old masonry between bricks and replacing it with new to make the building air and water tight.

It was the first time a thorough job had been done on the bricks of the schools since before the war, Ireland said, although masonry which badly needed attention had been fixed from time to time.

In the future, Ireland stated, the school masonry will receive a regular annual check-up so that it is kept in good condition, thereby eliminating the large expense of having a full pointing-up job done.
