Issue of August 1

Issue of August 8
Effective from 9 a. m. tomorrow morning—August 9—the Birmingham Police Department will not hand out any more "warning" tickets for the failure of motorists to put pennies or nickels into the City's new parking meters. From now on, they'll be the real thing.

Issue of August 15
It was announced this week that seven times as many new telephones have been installed in Birmingham area in the last six months as were installed in any six-month period during the war.

Birmingham's three taxicab companies petitioned the City Commission Monday night to raise the rates charged by the companies to permit absorption of the increased cost of taxicab operation. John B. Issue of August 15
Public installation of American Legion officers for the seventh district, encompassing all of Oakland county and a large part of Wayne county, will be held at the Community House here, Chet Brown, commander of the Birmingham post, announced this week.

The Rev. George L. Rentschler of New Jersey will be the new assistant minister at the First Presbyterian Church beginning Sept. 1. He was announced by the Rev. W. Glen Harris.

Edward W. Schultz of Coolidge highway was killed during his nephew, Raymond Leafdale of Big Beaver, and Mr. and Mrs. John Murphy of Cedar drive, injured, in an automobile Sunday morning on Maple road near the Bere airport.

Issue of August 22
Paul D. Carter, principal of Adams School, was named director of elementary curriculum for the Birmingham public schools by the Board of Education.

While the Board of Education has received an encouraging number of calls from Birmingham residents offering rooms for teachers for the coming seasons, Dr. Dwight B. Ireland, superintendent of schools, reported his approval of housing of teachers.
