City Not In Favor Of Maple Ave. As East-West Hi-Way

As far as the City Commission is concerned, Maple avenue will not be an east-west State trunking highway. Instead, efforts will be made to put east-west traffic on the 16 Mile road or 14 Mile road, the city's north and south corporate limits.

Not Enough Traffic "It was advised that the highway department believed the east and west traffic volume in this vicinity did not justify any construction on the part of the state, nor did it justify designating any east and west route in this vicinity as a state trunk line highway," Egbert explained.
