Capt. Rohn Awarded Bronze Star Medal

Captain Jack L. Rohn, 18814 San Diego Blvd., United States Army, was recently awarded a citation and bronze star medal from General Douglas MacArthur for a significant contribution to the available information on airplane structural requirements for wartime combat service.

According to the Air Corps release, Captain Rohn served in the Pacific area from July, 1944, to May, 1945, as a special representative, Air Technical Service Command, with the Far East Air Force on New Guinea. He "inaugurated and promoted a program of flight data recording on airplanes engaged in combat operations. He capably supervised the installation of delicate recording instruments in 73 operational aircraft of six different types, distributing them to 11 separate units for trial and experimentation. He accomplished his highly technical mission despite acute shortages of special equipment and material."
