

Adams-Quarton Lead Grade School Race For Court Honors

Ken Wilson scored seven points for the winners in this tight game while Dick Sales tallied two. Jackson accounted for all of Pierce's points.

These games put Adams and Quarton into a tie for first, each having five wins and three losses, and one game apiece remaining on the schedule. If both teams win their games next Saturday, a playoff contest will have to be scheduled.

All candidates are required to submit a letter of recommendation from their school principals in order to qualify for the competition. The examinations will be given on Saturday, April 13.

In addition to the results of these tests, the following factors are taken into consideration in selecting the winners: previous school record, character and leadership, special cultural abilities such as art, music or dramatics, health and athletic ability and the need of financial assistance.

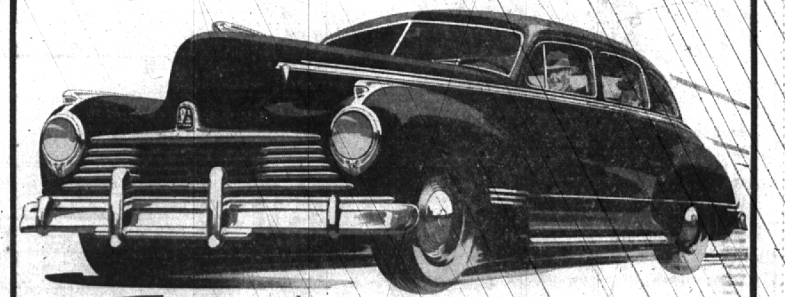
