Mrs. Mahlin Stevens, an early president, gave an account of the growth of the area below Lincoln street, which was the site of a school. She told the organization of a Parent-Teacher Association which occurred during this period to amuse her listeners.

Mrs. O. Peters, also a former president, spoke of the interest in the early organization and the struggle during the depression years to raise money to support the mill fund for the children of the school.

Mrs. Victor Ozden, while not serving as president, gave numerous details as to the activities of the association. She gave an interesting account of contests in gardening among the children and of a campaign to furnish pictures for the school. Mrs. Ozden told that present that if she were in the association today her first motion would be for a committee to act on the problems of housing for our teachers.

Mrs. Harry Musselman, a former president who now resides in Farmington, related her experiences and the many pleasures she received through the cooperation of members. Mrs. Musselman was the first president from the Pierce organization to attend a state convention for the Michigan Congress of Parents and Teachers.

Mr. George Viter, former superintendent of schools in Birmingham, spoke briefly on the construction of the school and gave several interesting facts about all of the early schools in Birmingham. The audience was greatly amused to hear some of his experiences in the field of education in this city.
