These services, now in their twenty-seventh year, are to be held daily, Mondays through Fridays, throughout Lent, from 12:10 to 12:50 p. m. at Central Methodist Church on Woodward avenue at Grand Circus Park. Hospital Head Tells High Twelve Club Of His Work At Ypsilanti

One of the most inspiring talks of this season's programs was made by Dr. J. H. Runkel, head of Birmingham High Twelve Club Monday evening when Dr. O. Ray Yoder, superintendent of Ypsilanti State Hospital, spoke on "Mental Rehabilitation."
He advised that the institution grounds cover one hundred and twenty acres while cases range from the ages of nine to ninety-five years. Speaking of the "high twelve" as continuous and going on," he mentioned that through progress and invention many ruder treatments of the past have developed into the shock and fever treatments now considered as essential in the treatment of patients.
He defined insanity as "a prolonged departure from the normal," happiness in the life of each individual." He said "Man, being an experiment in nature, it is well to keep interested in various activities to retain the proper balance." He pointed out the ratio of one out of every two babies born develop into mental cases and said that through frustration, many develop into mental cases. He stressed a spiritual thought as a necessity and the love of God, man and country as essential.
Many programs will be under the leadership of John Maynard, starting with Dr. McPherson of Detroit Metropolitan Methodist Church as the next speaker. He will be introduced by the Rev. A. F. Runkel of Birmingham First Methodist Church.

Dr. James S. McGaw of Chicago is to be the guest speaker of the United Christian Fellowship Sunday, March 3, at 2 p. m. at the Masonic Temple, Royal Oak. His subject will be "The Shekina."
Mrs. Carl Graves, soprano, of Hazel Park, will sing. Dorothy Young, contralto, of Royal Oak, will accompany Mrs. Graves and for the hymn sing. Verne Gaudreau, pianist of Detroit, will lead a song service preceding Dr. McGaw's address.

CAN ENLIST IN NAVY

A reminder to men of draft age that they may now enlist directly in the Navy was issued today by Commander Jasper E. Fleming, officer in charge of Navy recruiting in lower Michigan. "Many men between the ages of 18 and 30 apparently are still unaware that they may enlist in the Navy even though they have received their Selective Service pre-induction physical examination," Commander Fleming said. "With the draft board's approval, enlistment can be effected for two, three, four or six year terms in the peacetime Regular Navy even after the pre-induction examination has been taken."
