

Farm Machine Show At Pontiac, Feb. 12th

Since there is to be no Farmers' Week at the Michigan State College this year, Oakland county is helping to arrange a one-day pageant of over 100 labor-saving devices which have been so helpful during the war period. The exhibition will be shown in the armory at Pontiac Tuesday, Feb. 12, from 10 a. m. to 4 p. m.

Community Farm Bureau groups, dairy committees and ordinary Granges will help to promote the exhibit. One feature of the caravan will be an exhibition of labor-saving devices developed by local farmers.

Whiteley succeeds W. A. Butler, business manager of the Holland Evening Sentinel and Holland City News.

First vice-president is George W. Campbell, Owosso Argus-Press; second vice-president, Nelson D. Brown, Ingham County News, Mason; treasurer, Leslie S. Merritt, Livingston County Press, Howell.

New directors: James A. Gallery, Tuscola County Advertiser, Caro; Berkeley Smith, East Tawa News, and William A. Myers, Lapeer County Press, Lapeer. J. S. Gray, Monroe Evening News, was re-elected to serve a second term.

Elected members of the Michigan Press Service Advisory Council were Rollo Mosher, Wayland Globe; Iak White, Clinton County Republican-News, St. Johns; C. Davies, Ogemaw County Herald, West Branch; Robert Strong, Crawford Avalanche, Grayling; and Richard Cook, Hastings Banner.

Oldest living past president is former Governor Chase S. Osborn, now 86, whose son, George A. Osborn, is publisher of the Sault Ste. Marie Evening News. Mr. Osborn served in 1895 and his son, George, was president in 1943. Two newspapers in Michigan, still existing under the same name, are charter members of the association 78 years ago: The Ingham County News, Mason, and the Detroit Free Press.

M.S.C. Awards Are Now Being Offered

Michigan State College alumni are again offering sixty-four \$136 scholarships—a minimum of one award to each senatorial district in the state—to graduates of accredited high schools, according to Glen O. Stewart, director of alumni relations.

The stipend represents a waiver of tuition by the college and candidates must have been in the upper one-third of their high school class. Only entering freshmen will be considered, and the scholarships are not available to students who have taken college or university work. All applications must be filed with the district chairman not later than April 15.

A maximum of six candidates may be chosen by each senatorial district committee, and the candidates will take a comprehensive examination in May. Final awards will be granted by the M.S.C. committee of scholarships. A scholarship may be renewed for the full period of undergraduate training at the college provided the recipient maintains a high scholastic standing.

The chairman on alumni undergraduate scholarships for Oakland county is Martin F. Rummel, 152 Illinois avenue, Pontiac.

SEEDS OVERSEAS
The United States Relief and Rehabilitation Administration is rushing more than 50,000 tons of wheat, barley, oats and rye seed and seed corn; forage crops, grasses and root crops for animal feed; vegetable seed and seed potatoes; some industrial seeds, principally for oil and fibre, and also seeds for sugar. These seeds will go to nine European countries and China to provide basic requirements for farmers in time for spring planting.
