## Year-Around Fishing

Birmingham fishermen are warned that there are no lakes in Oakland county or Southern Michigan open to year-round fishing. Only lakes above M-46 have been given that status. This highway extends from Muskegon on Lake Michigan, and runs east through Newaygo, Howard City, Edmore, St. Louis, Saginaw and Port Sanilac, on Lake Huron.

## Students Given Information About Service In Army

According to Captain Trump, "It's a good opportunity—anyway you look at it. He went on to explain that anyone now enlisting in the regular Army would be entitled to the full benefits and privileges offered by the G. I. Bill of Rights. As far as students of Birmingham High School are concerned, the outstanding of these many benefits are the broad educational opportunities which permit Army veterans to enjoy as many as four years of free schooling.

"For example," said the captain, "high school graduate who enlist for a three-year period will have the opportunity of attending the college of their choice following their honorable discharge from service. Not only will they have at least \$300 in cash—their mustering-out pay for foreign duty—but while they are attending college, the government will pay them a minimum of \$50 per month for living expenses. Tuition, books and fees will be taken care of by the \$500 per year which the government pays to the college or university which the veterans attend.

In inviting senior students of Birmingham High School to drop in for further first-hand facts and information, Captain Trump emphasized the fact that the Army is not encouraging students to leave school prior to graduation.
