### Noted Episcopalian Leader To Preach At Christ Church Sunday

The Rt. Rev. Thomas N. Carruthers, D.D., bishop of South Carolina, will be the guest preacher at Christ Church Cranbrook on Sunday, January 13. He will preach at the Student Service at 9:30 a.m. and at the Morning Prayer service at 11 a.m. Bishop Carruthers was consecrated in May of 1944 and is considered one of the outstanding young leaders of the Protestant Episcopal Church. He has been chosen by the presiding bishop, the Rt. Rev. Henry St. George Tucker to be his personal representative to travel about the middle west describing the program of the reconstruction and advance fund, which is part of the national campaign to raise funds to help in rebuilding the war-torn areas of the world.

The Rev. Charles H. Cadigan, rector of Christ Church Cranbrook, will read the service at 11 o'clock for Bishop Carruthers and the choir will sing especially selected music. At the Student Service at 9:30 the Reverend Walter H. Young, assistant to the rector and chaplain at Cranbrook School, will read the service for Bishop Carruthers.
