

Supervisors Told Value of Airport

The Oakland county board of supervisors studied the question of a large airport in the southern section of the county when the board met last week at Pontiac. Interest centered in the proposal for locating the Detroit area's major airport near Oak Park.

Among the speakers before the board were M. W. Cochran of 315 Puritan, Birmingham, who said a study is being made as to what the Oakland county location of such an airport would mean to the entire area. He told the supervisors that planes approaching and leaving the airport would be 1,000 to 2,000 feet over Woodward avenue and therefore the airport would not constitute a nuisance, Mr. Cochran is now a Detroit airport engineer.

Other speakers included Allen Dean, transport consultant of the Detroit Board of Commerce and Col. Thomas G. Lamplifer, Detroit, on terminal leave from the Army Air Force.

COL. DODDS DISCHARGED

Col. Bruce R. Dodds is with his wife and daughters, Barbara and Mary, at their home on Puritan Road. He was discharged on Dec. 23 at Tacoma, Wash., and arrived home early Christmas morning. Col. Dodds has been in service for over three years and was overseas for a year and a half of that time.
