

Sugar Rationing Task is Now Divided Between Pontiac and Detroit Offices

Since January 1, 1946, all sugar rationing has been removed from the Pontiac Board to the Food Ration Board, 144 West Fort Street, Detroit.

There are three applications that will be stocked by this board at Pontiac for the convenience of the public. These may be had for the asking at the information window.

These at Pontiac

Application for Sugar Ration Book R-146. To be used by discharged members of the armed forces, infants and people entering the country who have never been eligible for ration books. This form is being distributed at all Army and Navy discharge centers for the convenience of the veterans.

Consumers replacement application R-194. To be used for replacement of lost, destroyed, stolen, wrongfully withheld or mutilated ration books or sugar ration coupons. In case of a mutilated War

Ration Book Four, be sure the old book is sent in with the application for the sugar ration book.

Applications for temporary sugar rations for members of the armed forces not entitled to a ration book R-353. Rations will be granted to service personnel for a period not less than 7 days and if meals are to be taken at a place where sugar is acquired by using the stamps or coupons of the people eating there.

Others at Detroit

All other application forms used in sugar rationing must be obtained by the consumer, retailer or wholesaler from the District Office.

In case of illness, the consumer should apply directly to the District Office by letter. With the letter, he must furnish a medical certification by a licensed practitioner.

Sugar for bee feeders forms R-350, should be used for this ap-

lication but the form must be obtained by the consumer from the District Office.

Replace Lost Sugar

Sugar to replace lost, damaged, destroyed or stolen sugar. Application must be made by letter to the District Office. The letter must contain the following information:

(a) The amount of sugar to be replaced;

(b) How the sugar was lost, damaged, destroyed or stolen.

(c) A statement that the applicant gave up valid ration evidences for the amount of the sugar he wished to replace.

The rations issued will be either in the form of one or ten pound coupons or the new sugar ration book. The new sugar ration book, Form R-352, consists of one No. 39 sugar stamp and nine spare stamps. These will be valid and have the same value as the corresponding stamps in War Book IV.
