### Finds Way to Locate Relatives or Friends Residing in Germany

Mrs. Byron Hestebold of 421 Madison reports that she has recently received information as to the proper way to address communications to relatives in Germany. She states that information to her is as follows: "Write the letter; on the envelope put the last known address of the family in Germany. Do not put any postage on this envelope but place the letter and envelope in another envelope addressed to the American Joint Distribution Committee, 19 Rue de Teleran, Paris, 8, France. On the outer envelope place the regular postage to Paris, which is 3 cents for the first ounce and 3 cents for each additional ounce. The committee will locate the letter and deliver it to whom the letter is addressed, but if the letter cannot be delivered, it will be returned to the sender."

### Servicemen Asked To Re-enlist Now For Army Service

Sgt. Joseph J. Manfred of the Birmingham recruiting office announced today that his office will remain open from 8 a. m. until 9 p. m. Saturday, Jan. 26, and from 8 a. m. until 11 p. m. on Thursday, Jan. 31, to enable all veterans of this area who wish to enlist and retain their grades to do so before the Jan. 31 midnight deadline. He reminded all veterans that in order to retain their grades they must enlist within 30 days of their discharge and before midnight of the 31st. There are openings in the Michigan recruiting district for veterans who qualify. Remuneration is bonus plus \$105 a month for subsistence. The U. S. Army recruiting office for the Birmingham district is located at the Birmingham Community House.
