New Curriculum In Engineering To Be Offered At U. of M.

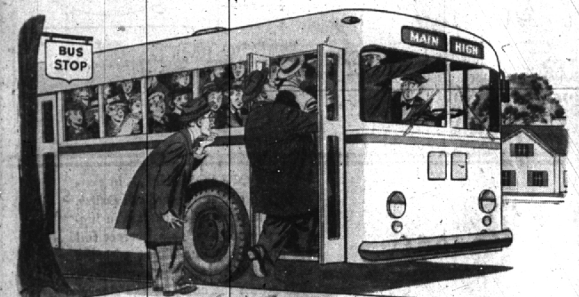
ANN ARBOR—A new four-year curriculum in mechanical and industrial engineering will be offered by the College of Engineering at the University of Michigan, effective with the start of the Spring Term on March 4.
The new curriculum, which replaces the five-year program will lead to a degree of Bachelor of Science in Engineering (Industrial-Mechanical). The five-year program was based on the requirement of 144 hours of undergraduate work for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Engineering (mechanical engineering) and 24 hours of graduate work for the degree of Master of Science in Industrial Engineering.

No change has been made in the basic requirements for the new four-year curriculum, said 140 hours of undergraduate work will be required for the degree. It is felt that a student who wishes to take further work in the industrial field will find no difficulty in selecting courses to suit his requirements.
