A total of 1,955 servicemen, ex-servicemen and their families contacted the Home Service Department of the Oakland County chapter during the month of December, of which Mrs. Sheldon Noble is chairman. This service was given through the two home service offices of the Chapter in Pontiac and Royal Oak.

Assistance to active servicemen consisted of: replies to inquiries and messages; providing information and social histories; verification of furloughs and furlough extensions; reports on health of families of servicemen; assistance with government benefits; counsel consisted of: assistance with claims and benefits and with hospitalization; consultation and guidance, reports to the Veterans Administration.

Twenty-nine volunteers assisted with the activity of the service both in a clerical capacity and in direct work with individuals.

New Winter Term Enrollment At M.S.C. Sets New High Mark

Michigan State College's registration for the winter term has reached the highest mark ever recorded by the college in its 80-year history, according to Registrar Robert S. Linton. Total enrollment is 7,223, a 65 per cent increase over a corresponding term last year.

Included in the registration figures are 3,274 full-time men, 3,410 full-time women, 207 Army trainees, and 332 short course students. World War II veterans enrolled number 2,219—2,066 men and 35 women enrolled as full-time students and 121 men and three women enrolled for short courses.

Ralph W. Tenny, director of the short course institute, reports the following enrollments in short courses: Home Economics, 37; general agriculture, 109; agricultural engineering, 25; Commercial Fruit production, 18; dairy manufacturing, 17; Dairy Production, 19; engineering, 16; practical floriculture, 2; and horsemanship, 7.
