Red Cross Is Busy Aiding Servicemen Secure Furloughs

Many Birmingham workers with the American Red Cross, which acts as a fact-finding agency in determining the need for emergency furloughs both in the country and overseas were on duty in Oakland county during the Holiday season. Volunteers and staff members of the Oakland County Chapter were available day and night in order that verifications might be made and information relayed to Washington or Army Posts at soon as possible. While delays are sometimes experienced due to unavoidable conditions the service is most frequently prompt one.

During the week preceding and including Christmas the wires were received and sent by the local chapter in both Home Service offices. Following receipt of wire, workers immediately secure confirmation of the situation after which the information is forwarded immediately. Frequently a great number of telephone calls are required to secure the data required. Individuals in communities have been most helpful in making calls where the families do not have telephone service.

Red Cross directors also assist by notifying chapter office or the chapter emergency number when families in their communities are anxious to contact their sons in service.

For some months decisions as to overseas leaves and furloughs have been made in the office of the adjutant general, Washington, D.C. instead of the serviceman's commanding officer overseas. Families in which emergencies arise requiring a serviceman's presence at home are advised that the best method of hastening his return is to consult the local chapter immediately.

The week of Jan. 7 will see the opening of the second term of the Board of Education, Ferndale Adult Evening School. There are classes Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings. During the first term 27 persons were enrolled from Birmingham.

Three classes which would be of interest to veterans and industrial employees are painting and decorating, sheet metal and mechanical drawing and blue print reading. The course in painting is instructed by Leonard Day, of the Michigan State Department of Vocational Training. This return is open to anyone interested in the painting trade as well as home owners, building managers, maintenance men, painters and decorators. The course in sheet metal is instructed by Walter Korolik, who teaches the same course in one of the largest Detroit industrial trade schools. Blue print reading and mechanical drawing is being instructed by Gerrit Gaskill, who has had both public school and industrial trade school experience. In addition to these there are thirty-one other courses being offered. Enroll the first night of the course.
