Many On Hand For Monday Lecture on Christian Science

That love is the healing, saving power, law and nature of God; and that in its true sense it is individually expressed by the spiritual, real man, rather than in a personal, limited mortal sense, was the theme of a Christian Science lecture delivered Monday evening by Gordon V. Comer, C.S.B., of Denver, Colo., at Baldwin High School auditorium. The speaker was introduced by William T. Udey, first reader of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, of Birmingham. Mr. Comer is a member of the Board of Lectureship of the Mother Church, the First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass. A large audience was on hand for his lecture.

He took for his subject, "Christian Science: The Religion of Love." In his lecture he said: "Can I understand Love. "We may not always understand the words which another speaks, but if there is love in his expression, a warmth of feeling in his hand clasp, or tenderness and understanding in his manner, we never fail to understand these. "Never has anyone, since the days of Christ Jesus, more clearly expressed true Love than did Mary Baker Eddy, the Discoverer and Founder of Christian Science. And that is why people in almost every land are grateful to her. They have felt the warmth of true love which is expressed in her writings, and have been blessed and healed by it. "Does it occur to you that there must be some great secret to such effective healing methods? There isn't. It is as simple as we have told you. Any conscientious student of the Bible and of Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures by Mary Baker Eddy can quickly gain the light which will reveal the truth to him. "When we learn from our study of Christian Science that man is perfect because he reflects God, who is infinite perfection, it means to us and rightly so, that God's man is never sick, for sickness is not part of God. That is an absolutely true statement of Christian Science. When on the other hand we read in the Christian Science textbook that God has no sin and sin and lack, do we have an inconsistency confronting us? No, not at all. The first states the ab-
