When you chill together a can of consommé, some of your garden-fresh beans, cream, and ruddy tomatoes help.

Also notably easy and good served cold are the canned condensed soups, having cream stock for a base. Condensed cream of tomato and condensed cream of green pea are colorful and captivating served cold with a collop of sour cream, whipped cream, or egg fluff floating on the surface.

Chilled Cream of Green Pea Soup Combine—

- 1 11-oz. can condensed cream of green pea soup, undiluted.
- 2 cups milk
- 1/2 teaspoon dehydrated horseradish
- 1 teaspoon sugar.

Pour into a refrigerator tray and chill for 10 minutes. Serve cold. Garnish with Whipped Egg White Garnish (recipe below).

Whipped Egg White Garnish

- 1 egg white.
- Add, during whipping—
- 1/2 tsp. salt.

Place a spoonful on chilled soup. Top with a dash of paprika. Serves six.

Vichyssoise

- 1/2 cup consommé or bouillon
- 1/2 cup diced raw potatoes.
- 3 cups diced raw potatoes.

Add—

- 1/2 cup finely minced onion.
- Continue cooking until potatoes are tender. Put potatoes through ricer saving liquid. Add rice potatoes to potato liquid.
- Add—
- 1 teaspoon prepared yellow mustard.
- Cool, then add—
- 1 1/2 cups cream or milk.
- 1/2 teaspoon salt.
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper.

Chill thoroughly before serving; garnish surface with chopped chives.

Oakland County RED CROSS NEWS

Mrs. Sheldon Noble, of Cranbrook road, chairman of home service of the Oakland County Chapter, American Red Cross, offers the assistance of Red Cross Home Service to all veterans of all wars as well as to men now in service.

Mrs. Noble states that many of the men returning from overseas in World War II have had malaria or have been exposed to the disease. Many men who have never had an attack overseas have been known to experience the disease upon return. It is important that those men who have had an attack, either overseas or upon return, file a disability claim with the Veterans Administration to establish service connection for this disability.

It is also important that veterans suffering from malaria keep a complete record of dates of attacks and medication received. Once a claim is established, periodic physical examinations will be made by the Veterans Administration and the patient will be required to present a complete record of dates of attacks and medication received.

Within a year from separation from service information can be given by individuals present during the attacks. However, after the expiration of a year the statement of a physician is necessary.

H. L. Lawson Buys Weekly Paper At Jonesville, Mich.

Mr. and Mrs. H. L. Lawson, of Birmingham, have purchased the "Jonesville Independent," a weekly newspaper serving Jonesville and Hillsdale County.

SUNDAY DINNER Suggestions

MELON time is here again, with cantaloupes, watermelons and honeydews currently coming to market in good supply. Housewives who know how to select, keep and serve these cooling summer fruits can add many a just-right touch to the breakfast, luncheon or dinner menu.

All melons are good sources of Vitamin C (four-fifths as rich as orange juice) and are easy to prepare. The best way to make sure of getting a ripe, full-flavored cantaloupe or honeydew, says the A&P Service for Home-Makers, is to pick out one with full fragrance. In choosing a watermelon look for one that is firm, symmetrical, of a rich green color, yellowish on the under side, and not too hard to the touch. A ripe melon, thumped on the side, will emit a dull, hollow sound.

Score all ripe melons in the refrigerator. If cut melon pieces should be covered tightly with waxed paper to prevent their drying out.

Melons, cut in halves, slices or wedges, frequently are served alone as a tasty-breakfast fruit, as a cooling appetizer at luncheon and dinner, or as a tangy dessert. Lemon or lime juice may be added for extra flavor, while other epicures prefer a slight sprinkling of sugar or salt. The meat of all melons may be scooped into balls or small pieces and combined with other fruits and berries in fruit cups or salads. A delicious summer dessert can be made by using a melon slice as a container for fruit mixtures, ice cream or sherbet.

For Sunday dinner, serve a chilled cantaloupe section as an appetizer with a main course of roast duck and stuffing, scalloped potatoes, mixed green salad, ice cream and a beverage.
