

Schools Had 111 Tuition Students During Past Year

During the past year, Birmingham elementary and high schools served 111 non-resident, tuition paying students, according to a report by Mrs. Irene B. Stevens, chief accountant for the Board of Education.

The state provided \$113.50 for each of the 85 out-district students who did not have educational facilities in their own communities. Either the school district or the parents provided the balance of \$28.50 to make up the tuition rate of \$181.80. In 67 cases the

district made up the balance; in 18, the parents paid, depending on whether or not the district provided a high school education for its students.

In the case of the 26 students who elected to come to Birmingham when there was already a high school in their community, the parents paid the full tuition.

In order that parents may discuss tuition problems for out-district students, Mrs. Stevens will be in her office in the Hill School, Chester at Martin, after September 5.

Summer Months Require Extra Caution To Remain Off "Careless Accident" List

Now is the time of year when the accidental injury and death toll begins chalking up the greatest number of its victims from cities like Birmingham. Fatal accidents, according to the Council, visit one home out of every 1100 every year, without sun too long, when a housewife may have a carning accident, when a little lad will run on a bike in a hurry and hop into the side of a car, when a motorist is apt to become careless with his driving, or when a tourist will become involved in an accident because he drove when overtired.

Car, bicycle and train accidents loom up alarmingly during summer months. During the last year, 2,074 persons in the nation met death at grade crossings, while 4,275 were injured, according to the National Safety Council reports. Most of these train accidents were daytime accidents, and one-third of them occurred at protected crossings. It pays to heed that stop, look and listen sign.

Don't Drive If Aired

Summer tourist drivers are warned not to drive when overtired, as it impairs alertness and may cause an accident. Remember these daytime accidents, and twice the thinking distance before you start to stop, four times the braking distance before you stop, and four times the force of collision if you can't stop.

In April of this year, the traffic death toll reached 2,650, a 47 per cent increase over last year. Drive carefully, the Council warns; you may meet a fool. Drive right, and there will be more pedestrians left.

Housewives doing summer canning with pressure cookers or canners are warned to follow the manufacturer's directions implicitly. Mothers who leave their children with a baby sitter are enjoined to leave with the sitter the phone numbers of a doctor, a neighbor, and where the parents can be reached.

Every person should know, too, what to do in case of the summer maladies, heat, exhaustion, and sunstroke. The general rule for treatment of these conditions is to make a cool patient warm, and to make a hot patient cool as possible. For sprains, apply cold packs, and for bruises, heat.

Summer swimming accidents, too, may be averted by following several general rules: don't swim immediately after eating; if you start to shiver come out of the water, and never go swimming alone.
