118 Teachers Now In B'ham District

An analysis of the present teaching staff in the Birmingham school district shows it now has 114 teachers, 6 principals, and 5 clerks, according to Superintendent Dwight B. Ireland.

Of the 114 teachers, 54 are located in elementary schools, 53 being women. In the junior high schools, there are 21 women and 6 men teachers; in the senior high schools there are 29 instructors, with 16 women instructors and 13 men teachers.

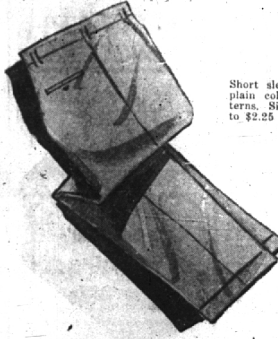
