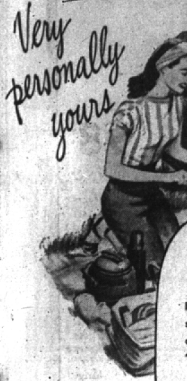


Backyard of Home Is Scene of Picnic
