Oakland County RED CROSS NEWS

Nine hundred individuals last week attended the Red Cross Water Safety classes sponsored by the Oakland County Chapter according to Mark Smith, chairman of this service.

Besides the regular program a number of volunteer Water Safety instructors are teaching special classes. Mrs. Helen Adams is teaching at Middle Straits Lake; Lillian Arvesen is teaching at Green Lake; Mr. Smith and Bradford Kempton are holding classes at Elizabeth Lake.

Mr. Smith states that the number of recent drownings should impress the public that the best insurance against such accidents is knowledge of individual safety in the water.

Precautions which each individual should take and which bear repeating are: Never swim or dive into unknown water; never swim when overheated or immediately after eating; never swim alone; never swim to the limit of one's strength; do not dive from a boat in the middle of a lake unless you are an expert and can reach shore if the boat floats away.

Many drownings could be avoided if each individual would observe these precautions and similar ones.

Bill to Streamline Congress Adds Cost, Dondero Says

By Esther Van Wagoner Tuffy Here's what one Michigan congressman has to say about the proposal to streamline Congress which recently was overwhelmingly defeated.

George A. Dondero pointed out that the three plans submitted to the House were intended to increase the efficiency of government; reduce bureaucracy and personnel and bring economy into government.

"But," said the Royal Oak veteran congressman, "the plans did not do those things."

He gave three reasons for his negative votes. 1. It was frankly admitted in debate that the plans would not reduce bureaucracy.

2. Instead of reducing governmental costs, it was shown that \$50 million dollars would be added.

3. Some governmental agencies set up by executive order during the war would be made permanent of the government.

The champion of private enterprise pointed to the Federal Housing Authority. It would become a part of a government agency, he said, and therefore would encourage government subsidized housing instead of building by private enterprise.

Dondero did concede governmental efficiency might increase a little but not enough in his estimation to outweigh the evils in the plans.
