French Refugee Joins Classes at Sherwood School

The roster at Sherwood School in Bloomfield Hills, now includes the name of little ten-year-old Nadine Oppert, refugee from France, whose father was killed by the Gestapo. Fast forgetting the five years she spent moving about from place to place, with her father, Yves Oppert, a leader of the French Maquis and known as "Lieut. Montcalm," Nadine anticipates no difficulty in learning the English language and American ways.

Nadine's mother said there was no future for the Jewish people in Europe now and that there will not be for some time to come. France, she said, is the best European country for Jews to live in, even if it is not the same as it was. Jews, she said, enjoyed life much in other people in France, before the war, but now there is little joy for them there. For Nadine, however, she feels all will be different. Nadine speaks no English, but a faculty member, Dr. Katherine Green, converses fluently in French, and little Nadine feels no qualms about learning the language.
