

Report on Street Program Is Given by City Manager

Birmingham residents who are interested in the progress of special assessment projects undertaken by the City of Birmingham for the improvement of city streets may be brought up-to-date by the information contained in a report from City Manager Donald C. Egbert to the City Commissioners at the commission meeting Monday evening.

The following street projects started after March 1, 1946, were reported upon:

Alley—George to London—District confirmed April 22nd. Over 90 per cent of the private property's share has been paid in and work started on the sewer.

Bennaville—Woodward to Grant—Special assessment roll confirmed May 27th. Work anticipated.

Maple-Willits Alley—Assessor directed to spread this Roll by Resolution Number 265, passed April 8th. Several property owners have a tentative agreement in regard to compensation for their property and negotiations are proceeding with the balance of the property owners.

Pieces Street Widening—Set for first hearing June 3rd.

Adams—Lincoln to Woodward—Roll reported back to Commission June 3rd. Hearing to be called June 17th.

West Maple Widening—Hearing set for June 3rd.

West Maple Sewer—Hearing June 3rd (first).

Winkleson Being Studied—Winkleson—Returned to Manager and Engineer for further study and report (Resolution No. 299-1946).

Harmon—Abandoned—By Resolution Number 266-1946.

Harrogate—Confirmed by Resolution Number 404-1946, passed May 13th, 1946. Over \$2,000.00 paid by the property owners; now preparing advertisement for contract for this surface.

Maryland Sewer—City Assessor directed to prepare roll by Resolution Number 341, passed April 20th. Being temporarily held up by hearings coinciding with hearings on water main.

Maryland Water—First hearing June 17th.

Hastata Street (South Portion)—First hearing called for June 10th.

Hastata Street (North Portion)—First hearing called for June 10th.

Action Rescinded—Oak Street—Referred back to Manager for further study and report. All previous actions rescinded.

Hasel—(Concrete pavement Woodward to Hunter). Confirmed by Resolution Number 457-1946, passed May 27th.

Eton Road—Maple to Yorkshire—City Assessor directed to spread Roll by Resolution Number 359, passed April 20th, 1946.

Torrey—Preliminary Resolution.

Reading Road—Preliminary Resolution only. There are at the present time negotiations underway with the Michigan State Highway Department to join the project to construct a highway.

Woodward—Storm water from the pavement drainage is not now adequately cared for and is flowing over private property.

Excelsior—Weber to the Fourteen Mile Road—Report to Commission June 3rd. Hearing called for June 24th.

Adams—Maple to Lincoln—Awaiting Engineering studies.

Tankers—Maple to Yosemite—Awaiting Engineering studies.

Cherry Court Sewer—This project presents a very difficult problem due to the length of sewer required to serve a comparatively few properties. Report will be presented June 10th.

Hearing June 17—Resolution to be passed June 3rd amending estimated costs. Roll report June 3rd. Hearing on Roll June 17.

Buckingham—Edenborough to St. Andrews—First hearing June 10th.

Ruffner—Woodward to Grant—Hearing called for June 24th. There are several projects. In addition to the above, for which the assessments have been confirmed and on which it is anticipated that work will be done during the present season.

Great Street Sewer—This project is included in the sewer contract which is now ready to advertise.

Fairview Water Main—A small job and will be done by our own forces next winter if funds are on hand.

Edenborough—Buckingham—Curb and gutter portion will be included in a curb and gutter contract for current season. Gravel will be placed by city forces.

Chapin Street—Sewer portion of this work will be included in sewer contract now ready to advertise.

Oak Street—From end of existing pavement to point between Grange and Westwood. Oil surfacing has been placed and a surface treatment will be applied this summer or possibly next year.

Some Work Completed

Holland—Torrey to Eton—Grading and traveling is complete. Curb and gutter will be included in the curb and gutter project to be contracted during the current season.

Weber—Torrey to Eton—This improvement provided for 26-foot gravel road. Project is practically complete. No further work will be done on this at the present. Some drainage structures to be maintained, however. This work will be held up until such time as this work is required to be done or possibly a curb and gutter contract with surfacing is approved.

Holland—Adams to Torrey—Confirmed 5-9-41. There has been 80 per cent paid. Nothing done as yet. Project calls for construction of a gravel road 28 feet in width to proper grade. The surfacing to be only oil treatment.

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Surface of certain streets in Harrowgate subdivision. The estimate of this project was based on a road mix job, however, if satisfactory bids are received there will be sufficient funds to have a plant mix job with machine finishing.

The sewer contract will include Birmingham Estate sewers, Grant street sewers, and a small sewer in Harrowgate subdivision. The estimate of the contract will in each case be dependent on securing a satisfactory bid.
