Maples Place 3rd In Class B Wayne Relays Saturday

By Knight Houghton At the twelfth annual Wayne Relays held Saturday at Denby Field in Detroit, local fans watched Birmingham thirlings place a close third in Class B.

Four field events, the 880-yard relay, and the medley relay were the only events in which Class B entries were accepted. The Maples' team of Jack Phister, Charlie Renfrew, Dick Murray and Bill Sproull captured a first, timed at 3:59.2. Sproull, Birmingham's anchor man, finished the relay with a lightning 880 run.

Birmingham's 42 record of 1:36.0 in the 880-relay was broken by an Ecorse quartet, Yarborough, Underwood, and Rogers, clocked at 1:35.1. Birmingham placed third.

7-Way Tie River Rouge took first and second in the pole vault, the locals placing two men, Bill Sproull and Ralph Mitchell, in first and fourth. Renfrew placed third for the Maples in the broad jump to 20 feet 10 inches.

Lanky McCants of River Rouge broke the 38 high jump record by 2 inches with his 6 feet, 10 inch leap. Don Buell captured fourth in that event.

Dana Eicar, Pete Greig, and Bud Gasser, always a dependable trio, took second, third and fourth respectively in the shot put. Smith of Wayne was first with a put of 48 feet, 3 1/2 inches.

The final tally for Class B was River Rouge, 26 1/7 points, Ecorse 25 1/4, Birmingham 22 2/7, Wayne 7 1/7, and Trenton 5 1/7. The Panthers won the crown from Trenton, defending champion.

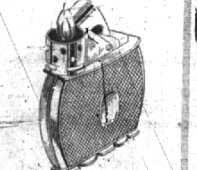
