It is expected that Sigler will win that election, as no Democrat has been elected governor in an off-presidential year since Woodbridge N. Ferris was elected in 1915.

"Smear Campaign" One of the great contributing factors toward Sigler's victory was the creation of the State Senate Investigating Committee last February, whose accusations at the time served to remove Sigler as special prosecutor of the State.

It is now apparent that the Senate Committee, created to remove Sigler from the Michigan judicial scene, really served as a political smearing device.

New Shelves Added To Care For Books In Baldwin Library

Browsers in Baldwin Public Library during the past weeks are so impressed with the new bookshelves that they have commented on an unusual bustle and moving of books. That's because Birmingham Library is growing up. A sure sign of library adulthood is the addition of "Back Stacks" which in plain English is a lot of shelves in the rear of the building to hold the overflow of books that are no longer current, but are too valuable to discard.

"In recent years, the book collection has grown tremendously in response to increased public demand," stated Miss Adeline Cooke, librarian. "Overcrowding made it difficult to fit new books into the shelves. New shelving in the quantity needed was only made possible by the grant from the State Board for Libraries. This grant is made to Birmingham annually as long as local tax support is properly maintained."

"This year, the grant amounted to \$597.51 and paid for several useful items that the city budget could not be stretched to cover.
