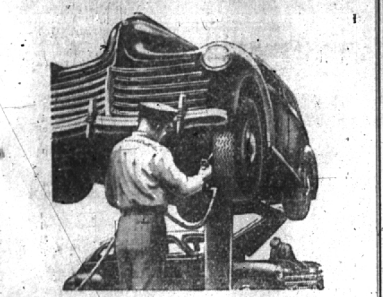

Army Chaplain Is Associate Pastor For Local Church Appointment of the Rev. James Wright of Detroit as associate minister of the Birmingham Methodist church was made by the Detroit

Recognition of volunteers of each service, American Red Cross certificates were presented to representative of each service and corps who had given 200 hours or more during the war period.

In announcing the change of policy on Sunday morning, the Rev. A. F. Kunkel said that the accelerated program of the church and the various youth and educational activities prompted the change. In addition, the associate minister will be special counselor for those returned and returning from the services.

He was born in Superior, Wis. December 17, 1916, and moved to Detroit in 1920, where his father was executive secretary of the Northwest Y.M.C.A. for 20 years. He attended Northwestern High School, Albion College, where he received his A. B. in 1939, and Yale, where he received his B.D. in 1942 and where he received the Merck Prize for excellence in preaching. He served in Michigan's Upper Peninsula from June 1942, until January, 1944, and was ordained an elder of the Methodist Church in 1943.

Mr. Wright entered the Army as chaplain in February, 1944, and served for nearly two years with General Patton's Sixth Army during the campaign through France, Belgium, Luxembourg, and Germany. He was commissioned a captain and awarded the Bronze Star Medal for "displaying exemplary courage, loyalty and devotion to duty, staying at the forward aid stations to assist the medical personnel with casualties and constantly accompanying the litter bearers forward to the front lines." Captain Wright returned to the United States last February, served at Percy Jones Hospital, and received his discharge June 6. Married in East Mr. Wright married Nancy Brown of Woodbridge, Conn., in August, 1942.
