City Requested To Clamp Down On Speeding Drivers

The matter of speeding on West Maple avenue and Oak street was brought before the City Commission by Birmingham residents, Monday evening.

Mr. Robert S. Davis, 1805 Pine and Mr. Hadden Smith, 1740 Oak street, appeared before the Commission to ask that a two-way stop sign be placed at the intersection of Oak and Chestnut streets as a precautionary measure that will help prevent small children from possible injury by speeding cars.

Mr. Davis told the Commission that, since the school vacation started, there has been considerable speeding on Oak street.

Children Risk Injury He referred to the number of young children in that area who will attend the summer recreational program at Quanton school and who might risk possible injury going back and forth across the street.

A written request by J. M. Jewell, Lake Park drive, suggested that police make a serious effort to keep down auto speeds on West Maple.

"Many drivers now using Maple operate their cars at greatly excessive speeds," Mr. Jewell wrote.

Removal of Shrubs Hampering Traffic, View Is Discussed

Shrubs which obstruct a clear view of approaching traffic at various street intersections are coming under City scrutiny. One hazard which the city proposes to eliminate as soon as possible is the high bushes at the intersection of Pleasant street and West Lincoln avenue.

According to City Manager Donald C. Egbert, these bushes will be trimmed so Pleasant street traffic may approach Lincoln avenue traffic, then later removed for transplanting at the proper time.

Two other shrub obstructions were mentioned by City Commissioners, one for southbound Hunter boulevard drivers negotiating a left turn onto Wimbeldon drive and another at the west gate of Greenwood Cemetery on Oak street.

July 22 will see a hearing on the Buckingham road and the south Henrietta street projects. West Maple widening, the West Maple sewer, and the Pierce street widening hearings were set for July 29.

UN Flag, Designed By Local Architect, Submitted for Organization's Approval

A United Nations flag, comprising the miniature flags of 51 nations arranged around a central theme, has been designed by Dr. Francis S. Onderdonk, who has recently joined the staff of Sarrinen, Swanson & Sarrinen, architects.

The flag, one of about 30 which have been submitted to Tryve Lie, secretary-general of the UN, is being displayed in one of the show windows at Shain's drug store.

"The border of the UN flag I designed consists of the individual national flags of the United Nations," Dr. Onderdonk explained.

"They are arranged geographically. Western and Northern Europe are along the top edge; flags of East-

ern Europe, the Near East, and Asia form the right edge; those of Africa and South America form the bottom and lower left edge, and flags of Central America the center of the left edge.

Fifty-five stars are arranged in an oval around the five continents, and form the central theme.

Senator Arthur H. Vandenberg has recently written Dr. Onderdonk: "I am grateful to you for your intensely constructive interest in the United Nations flag."

"Four United Nations flag... is an interesting and significant piece of work..." Senator Vandenberg in his letter, however, expressed doubt that the United Nations would adopt a banner for itself.
