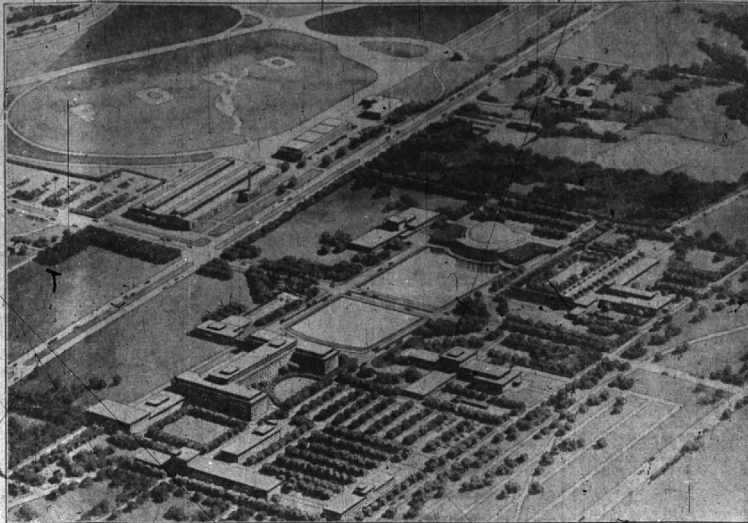

Ford Motor Co. To Build \$50,000,000 Research Center

Construction of the new Ford Research and Engineering Center in Dearborn, Mich., will begin as soon as regulations permit, Henry Ford II, president of the Ford Motor Co., stated Tuesday. Taking eight years to complete, an estimated \$50,000,000 will be expended in construction and equipment. It is to be located on a 500-acre tract west of Dearborn Inn.

The League of Women Voters report on the candidates for county, state and congressional offices to be elected at the June 18 primaries will be mailed to members and contributing non-members next Tuesday, according to Mrs. Robert Sillar, chairman of the project. Copies of this report will be available to interested voters who can secure one by telephoning Mrs. Alan Loufbourne, 2326

of the questionnaires sent to candidates for offices in Oakland county by the local Birmingham League in cooperation with the newly formed West Bloomfield League 23 replies were received. The questions requested specific information regarding business and educational background, public service, how the candidate would improve the office if elected, suggestions for streamlining the department.

Cooperate With Detroit The local League cooperated

with the Detroit League in sending out a similar questionnaire to candidates for the 17th Congressional district, requesting candidates' stands on issues such as OPA, atomic energy control, and the United Nations trusteeship problems. Questionnaires sent by the Birmingham League to candidates for the state legislature senators from the 33rd district and for state legislative representatives from the 3rd district requested besides background information, candidates' stands on questions such as consolidation of school districts, the fair employment practice code, minimum wage laws, child labor legislation and financing aids to municipalities.

The State League compiled the report on candidates for the office of Governor and Lieutenant Governor, which includes similar information.
