

Candidates for School Board Reply To Questionnaire of Women Voters

The Birmingham League of Women Voters has received replies to the questionnaire the organization sent to the two certified candidates for the Birmingham School Board elected next Monday, Roland W. Reese and Wylie E. Groves.

Two of the questions asked of the candidates were: "What financial suggestions do you have for a teachers' salary schedule that competes favorably with nearby school districts and for a program for a new school?" and "What suggestions do you have for new sources of revenue for school maintenance?"

Mr. Reese, seeking his first term on the Board, replied: "We need as much all at once that I would like to study methods before making recommendations, but I am aware that we need to create more funds for schools."

Mr. Groves replied:

"Mr. Reese, incumbent trying for his third term, answered: "Good teachers are the fundamental basis of a good school system. Under present tax laws, salary schedules are necessarily limited to school district income. Salaries should be the largest part of the school budget. It is impossible to put a dollar value on a teacher who has the ability to instill a desire to learn in a student. Good teachers are more important than fancy buildings or equipment."

"Under present state laws new schools other than small additions could only be financed by state or money grants. However, every forward-looking school district should provide for increased millage to establish a sinking fund for a start on new buildings."

"Under present laws, the local tax can be increased by five mills by a vote of the people."

Reduce State Taxes
"I am in favor of returning some of the state and federal taxing ability back to the local governments. In other words, reduce the federal and state taxes, and allow communities to increase local taxes. It is true that the state and federal government returns large sums of money to local communities. In state and federal aid, but this is more often done on a political basis rather than an equitable distribution. When your tax money

Oakland County RED CROSS NEWS

The Oakland County Chapter, American Red Cross, will again offer a water safety program to the public, beginning June 17, and continuing once a week for eight weeks during the summer months, according to Mark Smith, chairman of water safety.

Russell H. Palmer will direct the program and will be assisted by Jeanette Partridge and Gwen Kemp. Mr. Palmer is an authorized water safety instructor and has many years' background in this particular field.

Classes will be held at Avon Township Park, Lake Orion City Park; Stevens Beach, Oxford; Bush Lake, Holly; Watkins Lake; Chetolah Shores, Elizabeth Lake; Orchard Avenue, Cass Lake; Cunningham Park, Sylvan Lake; Walnut Lake, Walled Lake; Beaumont Subdivision, White Lake; Hazel Park High School Pool; Royal Oak High School Pool; Deer Lake, Clarkston. The day and time of each class will be announced later.

Red Cross instructors will award individuals satisfactorily completing the various tests, and classes are open to all ages. Individuals wishing to learn to swim may attend as well as those who wish to complete any particular test, including Junior and Senior Life Saving. Each year countless individuals suffer accidents in Oakland County because of their own personal safety. Red Cross classes are designed to teach skills which will guard against these accidents.

Clyde D. Underwood, former prosecuting attorney of Oakland County, announced this week

that he will again seek nomination for the office on the Republican ticket. His former tenure in the office of prosecutor extended from 1925 until his voluntary retirement at the end of his second term in 1929. He has engaged in private law practice in Pontiac since.

In announcing his candidacy, Underwood stated that his decision to reseek the office was prompted by the recent resignation of the present prosecuting attorney, which has caused the inefficiency which has prevailed in the office for the past few years. It is his belief that anyone not now connected with the office is needed to reorganize it, restore the confidence of the people and give them the honest and efficient law enforcement to which they are entitled.

The new board of directors of the Birmingham Community Council held the first meeting on May 28.

The president, Rev. A. F. Runkel, presided, and appointed the following committee chairmen to carry on activities of the Council for 1946-47: Adult education, Mr. Foster Carter; Bulletin, Mr. Foster Toothacker; institute chairman, Mrs. Cleveland Walcutt; and calendar, Austin Jones.

The first fall meeting of the council will be held at the Community House on October 16 and the tentative date for the annual institute sponsored by the council is January 15, 1947.

Members of the Board of directors will meet with a group from the University of Michigan on June 21 to discuss the workings of the Birmingham Council.

Dr. W. Cruickshank Leaves July 1 for Post at University

William M. Cruickshank, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ward Cruickshank of Merrill avenue, has completed his work for the Doctor of Philosophy degree at the University of Michigan. Dr. Cruickshank has taken his training in the field of Special Education, and is one of a small number of individuals in the United States trained in the education of the deaf, blind, retarded, epileptic, mentally crippled and speech defective.

Dr. Cruickshank has had a broad background of professional training and experience resulting in his undergraduate training at the Michigan State Normal College and his master's degree from the University of Chicago in addition to his doctoral studies at the University of Michigan. He also studied at the Michael Reese Hospital, Chicago and at the Clinical Psychology School conducted by the War Department.

Prior to his entrance in the Army Dr. Cruickshank was an instructor at the Horace Rauhman School of Special Education, Ypsilanti and at the State Teachers College, New York during the war he served as a clinical psychologist at the Armed Forces induction Station, Detroit, and with the 231st General Hospital in the European Theater. He assisted in establishing a psychological clinic at the Military Disciplinary Training Center, Lemans, France and later taught psychology at the American Army University, Shrivensham, England.

At present Dr. Cruickshank is the Special Education Executive in charge of a program of reorganization resulting from a study made of the institution at the request of Governor Harry Kelly. On July 1st he will go to Syracuse University in New York as director of special education and professor of education. At Syracuse he will have the responsibility of establishing a complete program for the training of teachers in all fields of education for the physically and mentally handicapped child.
