### Rotary Learns Of Problems of Dairy Farms In This Area

Levin W. Marley, public relations director of the Michigan Milk Producers' Association, spoke before the Birmingham Rotary Club Monday noon at its meeting at the Community House. His topic was "The Dairy Outlook for the Detroit Metropolitan Area." Mr. Marley's home is at 547 Henrietta.

In an interesting and informative way Mr. Marley explained the difficulties and problems of the dairy farmer in this region in his fight to maintain high production herds in face of the constantly mounting operational costs.

The speaker declared there was today a most serious labor shortage on dairy farms, a four per cent decrease in dairy cattle on farms, fewer dairy farms, an application, six per cent less milk being produced, as compared with one year ago.

He saw little opportunity for improving the quantity of output for the area before next season and, as to an increase in butter, he declared only a change in price arrangements for milk and
