Birmingham drew a bye in the first round of what may prove to be one of the toughest district tournaments to be held this year. March 7, 8, 9 in Ferndale's Lincoln High School gym.

The first round games match Cranbrook against Clawson, the Maples playing the winner of this game Friday night at 9:15. In the other contest, last year's district champs, Berkley meets Northville. Rochester also drew a bye and will play the victor of this fracas.

Cranbrook Strong

The Cranbrook season game will bring together two pretty evenly matched teams. The Cranbrook season record stands at ten wins and two losses, the latter at the hands of Mt. Clemens and a rangy Hovee five. Clawson's regular season record was nine victories and five defeats. This team placed third in the Suburban League, losing two to Berkley, one each to Madison and Roseville, and beating Van Dyke twice.

Clawson boasts the highest scoring player in Oakland county in Mitchell Overstrik. He scores 23 points in his last game, season record not being available.

Cranbrook announces this individual star with a trio of high scoring sharpshooters. John Wright, Jim Ederley and John Fry make up a combination that has netted most of Cranbrook's scores this season.
