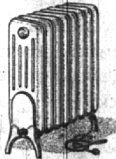

Be cautious of extravagant claims which imply that an electric heater may be operated indefinitely at low cost and yet have sufficient output to warm large areas. When an electric heater is used indiscriminately, abnormally high electric bills can result.

Here is a simple rule to follow in determining the amount of electricity a heater will use. Take the number of watts shown on the name plate divided by 1000 times 2 cents which will give you the minimum cost of operation per hour.

For example, the minimum cost of using a thousand-watt heater is equivalent to burning ten 100-watt bulbs or seventeen 60-watt bulbs. A 1000-watt heater costs 14¢ a week if used one hour daily for seven days. The same unit if used eight hours daily costs \$1.12 per week and \$4.80 per month. Buy your heater from a reliable dealer who can tell you the cost of operating a unit designed to suit your particular needs.
