Is Home On Leave Captain Howard Is Now Out of Service

Capt. John R. Howard III has returned to his home and civilian life after having completed nearly four years Army service. It was announced today by Colonel Quinton Adams, chief of the Detroit Ordnance District. He was discharged at Fort Sheridan, Ill., separation center Saturday.

Captain Howard entered the Army in May, 1942, with the rank of second lieutenant. Assigned to the Detroit Ordnance District May 26, 1942, he served in the tank branch where he was stationed at various plants as Army inspector of Ordnance. In August, 1944, he was made assistant chief of the entire tank branch.

For his work in the district, Lieutenant General L. H. Campbell, Jr., chief of the ordnance department, awarded him the Certificate of Commendation.

Before his entry into the service, the Captain was employed by the Ethyl Corporation as an engineer with the Research Laboratories. After his discharge the Captain will assume duties as an engineer in the technical service department of the same firm. Captain Howard and family reside at 1911 Worth street.

Army Recruits From County Show Increase

The local recruiting officer, Capt. F. A. Trumpf, stated today that recruiting in this section is above normal. Recruits are coming to the U. S. Army recruiting offices daily seeking enlistment in the regular Army, and information pertaining to the advantages offered by the present peacetime Army.

There were 101 enlistments in the United States Army during the month of February, 1946, bringing the grand total of 284 enlistments for Oakland county offices. Of these, 153 are from the Pontiac area, 79 Royal Oak, 11 Birmingham and 11 from Farmington Hills.
