Answers will be distributed to all League members, contributing non-members, and to anyone else who is interested, according to Mrs. Blair K. Swartz, education

committee chairman, directing the activity.

"To date the registration for the school election is very light, according to reports from the Board of Education offices," stated Mrs. Swartz. "I hope everyone will remember that on Saturday, June 1, last chance to register."

"For this election the qualifications for voting are that you must be a U. S. citizen; you must be 21 years old; and you must be a resident of the state of Michigan for six months and of the school district for at least 20 days prior to the date of election," she reminded voters.

Waugh, Ypsilanti Normal College, on "The Responsible Voter," and at the evening's banquet by Dr. Eugene B. Elliott, state superintendent of public instruction, on "The Little Red Schoolhouse at the Cross Roads."

Adopt Big Program  
The convention adopted the proposed state program of work for 1946-47 which includes working for a tax program to meet the needs of both state and local units of government; organization of state government for greater efficiency and economy; better financing of schools; and enactment of protective legislation for workers, especially in the area of child labor legislation.

Mrs. Frank C. Haskins of Flint, retiring president, set the keynote as she opened the first business session in pointing out the general feeling of frustration at the realization that the world is at the cross roads and its corollary feeling of apathy. "Here is where the League fits into the picture," stated Mrs. Haskins, "with our doctrine that the healthy thing always is to do something to act." She reported that membership in the state had grown from 900 two years ago to more than 1500 members. A new League, the West Bloomfield Township League, was accepted into membership in the state League.
