NOTICE

SERVICEMEN and VETERANS HOMESTEAD TAX REFUNDS

Under Act 24, Public Acts of Michigan, Extra Session of 1946, you are entitled to refund of certain taxes which may have been paid on your homestead during your service in the armed forces of the United States and for one year thereafter.

You are entitled to a refund of taxes paid to the amount of \$2000 of equalized (assessed) value of your homestead for each of the years 1944 to 1944, inclusive, subject to the following—

- 1. You must have entered the armed forces after December 31, 1939.
2. You must have owned your homestead during the year, or years for which the refund is claimed.
3. The taxes must have been paid while you were in service or during the first year after your discharge.
4. You must NOT have been the owner of more than \$5000 of taxable property for any year for which the refund is claimed.
5. You must make a refund affidavit and file it with the Assessor of the city.

WIDOWS of servicemen of World War II who died in service under honorable conditions, are also entitled to these refunds. If you are a serviceman or a veteran out of service less than one year you should make application for exemption on the current assessment roll before May 11th.

Refund affidavit forms and forms for application for exemption on current assessment roll are available at the office of the City Assessor, Municipal Building, who will assist you in making application.
