**Local SCF Group Hears Reports On Year's Activities**

At the first meeting of the executive committee of the Birmingham Branch of the Save the Children Federation, held last Friday, each new chairman of the group plans for a winter campaign were warmly discussed and past year's work, brought before the committee.

Members present were Mrs. Angus Melay, Mrs. James F. Mitchell, Mrs. C. D. Hartsuff, Mrs. Edward J. Maness, Mrs. George E. Green, Mrs. Allan B. Lutz, Mrs. Ewald K. Schadt, Mrs. Frederic W. Smith and Mrs. Philip Pretz.

Reporting on significant facts of the SCF for the past year, Mrs. Smith stated that two million children in America had participated in the program, supplying essential materials for European schools paper, pencils, etc.—as well as food, shoes and clothing.

Well Represented  
Birmingham, Bloomfield Township and Bloomfield Hills schools—private, parochial, and public—were well represented in the national drive. Many churches and organizations in Birmingham have assumed sponsorship as well, she stated, and private donors are numerous.

In the last concentrated drive, she recalled, over \$3,000 was contributed by Birmingham schools, churches and organizations, and was spent by the Federation, working closely with the Ministers of Education in France, Belgium, Holland and Norway, to try to build up the shattered schools in those countries.

Help, Mrs. Smith reported, is provided most effectively by supplying mental food to help restore the health of children so they can remember, and learn; by providing shoes and clothing so they can go to their damaged schools, and to provide school supplies.
