

Vesper Program Sunday Features Russian Music

Vesper service at Christ Church Cranbrook this Sunday at 4:30 p.m. will again feature a carillon recital by August Machelberg as the first part of the service. Following the recital, a musical service will be given in the church, consisting of Russian music for organ, violin, flute and voice.

Soloists for the Russian music will be Syver Thinstad, baritone; Axel Magnusson, violin; William Casey, flute, and E. W. Hill, organ.

Included in the carillon recital will be Machelberg's own composition, "Freude," also "Carry Me Back to Old Virginia," "A Toy," "Flow Gently Sweet Afton," and "Bach's Gavotte."

Russian selections will be Bu-buck's "Organ Prelude Fantasia," Wieniawski's "Legende" (violin); Rimsky-Korsakov's "Aria for Bass"; Stravinsky's "Berceuse from 'The Fire-Bird'"; Tchaikovsky's "Pavane"; and Rachmaninoff's "Serenade."
