ORDINANCE NO. 325
AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 11 (B) of Ordinance No. 113, entitled "An Ordinance Authorizing the Acquisition and Construction of Additions, Extensions and Improvements to the Water Supply System of the City of Birmingham by the construction of new wells and connecting mains and providing for the issuance of self-amortizing bonds for the purpose of defraying the cost thereof;" and to amend Act 12, Public Acts of Michigan, 1922, as amended; and the Sales Tax collection, segregation and disposition of the revenue of said Water Supply System and payment of said bonds out of the revenue thereof; creating a statutory lien on such revenues and providing for the matters relative to said bonds, the Water Supply System and the revenue therefrom; to be hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 11 (B) Bond and Interest Redemption Fund. There shall next be established and maintained a Bond and Interest Redemption Fund, which shall be used solely and solely for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Revenue Bonds authorized and provided for by the Ordinance and Act 12, Public Acts of Michigan, 1922, as amended; providing for the further collection, segregation and disposition of the revenue of said Water Supply System and payment of said bonds out of the revenue thereof; creating a statutory lien on such revenues and providing for the matters relative to said bonds, the Water Supply System and the revenue therefrom; to be hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 11 (B) Bond and Interest Redemption Fund. There shall next be established and maintained a Bond and Interest Redemption Fund, which shall be used solely and solely for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest on the Revenue Bonds authorized and provided for by the Ordinance and Act 12, Public Acts of Michigan, 1922, as amended; providing for the further collection, segregation and disposition of the revenue of said Water Supply System and payment of said bonds out of the revenue thereof; creating a statutory lien on such revenues and providing for the matters relative to said bonds, the Water Supply System and the revenue therefrom; to be hereby amended to read as follows:


