Women Voters Plan 22-Candidate Rally For October 21st

Before Oakland County voters go to the polls on November 5 they will have had a chance to meet and talk with the candidates whose names appear on the ballot.

Plans for the big political rally organized by the League of Women Voters are in the final stages, climaxing at the meeting of the Local Government committee held this week, guided by Mrs. Edwin V. Clarke, chairman.

The meeting, scheduled for October 21st at the Community House, covers ten congressional, state and county offices and the 22 nominees involved have been invited to speak and discuss their platforms with Oakland County voters on that date.

Service to Voters The League of Women Voters of Birmingham, West Bloomfield, and Royal Oak are cooperating in the work.

Chairmen and vice-chairmen of the political parties are invited to attend the informal session also, and invitations are being mailed to men's and women's organizations listed in Pontiac, Birmingham and Royal Oak.

The League of Women Voters is conducting the political rally as a part of its service to voters in an effort to provide them with the opportunity to know and ask questions of the men who will represent them in government after November 5th.

For All County Voters

"We want to impress voters that this is a 'Come one, come all' affair. The whole proceedings will be kept informal so everyone can join in the discussions if he chooses. We've asked candidates to speak very briefly and be ready to answer queries from the audience."

The League stressed that this meeting is for all voters in Oakland County, and its purpose is to make

it possible for them to meet candidates in person.

The session will begin promptly at 1:30 on Monday, October 21st, and it is hoped all voters will come, if only for a short time, to listen and take part.
